


THE INTERSTATE MEDICAL LICENSING COMPACT UPDATES & WHAT IT MEANS FOR PHYSICIANS

What is it?

If you meet the minimum qualifications, you are eligible to apply for licensure through the compact in any of the states that are currently participating. The IMLC was created in response to increased patient demand and a shortage of licensed providers to meet that demand. Through the IMLC qualified candidates can now become fully licensed in participating states without going through a traditional application process.

Multiple state licenses can be issued in a few weeks, with a single application.



Each of the states that are part of the IMLC will eventually become SPL states – many are expected to complete this process within the next few months. Many more states have legislation pending to join the IMLC.


Do I Qualify?

To qualify for expedited licensure under the compact, you must:

- Be board-certified
- Reside or practice in one of the eight states of principal licensure (see map below)
- Have no previous discipline on any state medical license or controlled substance license
- Not be under investigation by any licensing or law enforcement agency
- Have successfully completed a graduate medical education (GME)
- Have passed the USMLE or COMLEX within three attempts
